1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

It was under the parental care and stewardship of Late. Dr. Ardhendu Kumar Dey, the then Cabinet Minister of Food & Civil Supplies Department, Government of Assam and under active co-operation and generous help by eminent personalities especially and people in general of the Hojai Town and around, the college got its concrete shape and was established on a pious day of 2nd September, 1991 as Hojai Girls' College with inaugural class of Higher Secondary having a minnow strength of five girls only.

Hojai Girls' College is located in a spacious compound of about two acres of land on the Southern Part of Hojai Town. It is the lone Education Institute that caters to the need of Higher Education for women in the Districts of Hojai, Dima Hasao and Karbi-Anglong, where the need of such a female institution was long overdue. A great number of students of this College happen to be from different Tribal & multi – cultural groups of people of the region. From a very humble beginning, the college has over the years, attained full-fledged Degree College having an enrolment of 1,450 students registering their contribution in civil societies.

At present College imparts Arts Stream in Higher Secondary and Degree level and the medium of instruction in Higher Secondary and Degree level is Assamese and English. The Higher Secondary level of the College is temporarily recognized by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council and Degree level is permanently affiliated to the Gauhati University (Vide Letter No. EC Res. No.R/EC-01/2010. In the Initial stage the financial burden of the teaching and non teaching staff and all other are borne by the College Governing Body, collected from Student fees and other sources including public donations etc. In the year 2014 (w.e.f. 01/01/2013) the college was provincialised under the provisions of the Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of services) Act, 2011, Government of Assam. In the year 2016, the college achieved another milestone when it was recognized by the UGC under the provisions of the 2-F and 12-B of the UGC.

Vision

- The vision of the College is to cater the educational needs of Girl child from the remote corner, tribal, rural, semi urban areas irrespective of all class, caste and creed.
- To cater the academic needs of girls especially of those, hailing from economically and socially weaker sections and to harness their innate possibilities, enrich them with human values.
- The college aims and is dedicated to empower its students and to posit with technological expertise.
- The college strives towards molding them to knowledge based skill that will envisage them as human resource for the nation.
- The college is to help them to get aware and adapt to the needs and challenges along with realities of present socio-economic identity.
- The college works to shape them as ideal citizens of the country for a vibrant Indian Democracy and thereby to contribute toward upliftment of them and ultimately to lead them to corroborate to our enriched legacy of nation building.
- The faculties of the College lay stress on raising the aspirations of our learners and enable them to achieve their goals & to meet the challenges globally.

- The College always creates awareness among the students for their rights and responsibilities and teaches the team spirit and leadership skills to ensure success in their professional and career responsibilities.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

- The college is the sole provincialised institution for women of UG level in vast area of a radius 10 K.M. – with passing of years total students of it is increasing steadily.
- The college is situated at well within the town- it is well connected by different modes of communication, the Railway Station (Hojai Railway Station) is only 0.3 K.M. away from the college and the bus stand is only 0.2 K.M. away. The Medical and health centre (FRU), Police Station and Post Office are situated within a well proximity of the college.
- The college has a well qualified active, experienced a faculties who always interaction with the students for Academic and non academic problems.
- Regular monitoring of attendance, academic performance and overall holistic development of students.
- The result of the College is good however in Major courses the result is excellent.
- The College follows a strict discipline in and around the campus for both students and teaching & non teaching staff for smooth running of the College. Students admitted to the college have to abide by the

rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. A system of Bi-metric attendance system is installed to digitally monitor the attendance of the faculty and the support staff of the college.

- College has well equipped Education laboratory also having separate class room for Major course.
- Members of the Governing Body are eminent and experienced academicians and administrators who contribute substantially towards quality enhancement.

Institutional Weakness

- The College has a big shortage of regular teaching staff in every department. The College has to appoint Contractual teachers in every department to stabilize the academic atmosphere of the College.
- The number of students are increasing every year but on additional infrastructure is constructed due to fund shortage.
- The students of Karbi Anglong and Dima Hasao have to rent in Hojai locality for continuation of their studies as College has no Hostel facilities.
- The college has collection of good number of text books, Journal, reference books, which cater the needs of students. The College has no sanctioned post of librarian and Asst. Librarian so the College the library runs by the regular appointed library assistant and library bearer and a faculty member has been appointed as in-charge. The college has not yet digitalized the Library so the college authority has recently appointed a librarian on contractual basis to digitalize the library.
- The office administration is not yet fully computerized.
- Lack of Consultative and Placement opportunities for students within the campus.

Institutional Opportunity

- In order to draw the attention of the students many infrastructural changes have been made during the last few years. Computer and printers have been installed with internet facilities in the college library. Well equipped Education laboratory for the major Students.
- The college has introduced one year Hindi translation Vocational course from the session 2022-23 with eight students and signed MOU with Sabda Bharati .
- The College administration and the teaching staff created a good relationship with the students to speak their objections/opinions/suggestions freely without any fear and hesitation.
- Availability of students from Hojai, Dima Hasao and Karbi Anglong Higher secondary Schools that acts as feeder- institutions for the College.
- Highly qualified, efficient and committed faculty members who are capable of organizing and conducting seminars, workshops, conferences is an added opportunity to provide the scope to create more teaching-learning material and contribute to the various fields of education.

Institutional Challenge

- A good number of girls married without completing their course. Every departmental teacher tried their best to overcome from this problem through counseling in their routine class.
- There is lack of regular teacher so college has to appoint teachers on contractual basis. Whenever they explore alternative career they resign which leading to instability in the academic atmosphere and work in the concerned departments.

- The initiation of any new academic programmer/ job oriented courses requires a long and complicated procedure for getting permissions from multiple authorities which often delays the process.
- It is a challenge for the Institution to obtain the Grants and Funding from UGC for pursuing research projects.
- The College has to bear a huge amount for the salary of the Contractual teachers.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

It is the lone Education Institute that cater to the need of Higher Education for women in the Hojai District and entire part of Dima Hasao and Karbi Anglong autonomous council Where the need of such a female institution was long overdue. Presently College imparts ARTS Stream in Higher Secondary and Degree level and the medium of instruction in Higher Secondary and degree level is both Assamese and English.

Higher Secondary Course:

In the Higher Secondary level, two of the subjects, namely (i) English and (ii) Alternative English or MIL(Assamese/ Bangali/ Hindi / Manipuri) Environmental studies (HS 1st yr only) are the core subjects and are compulsory.

In addition, a candidate must select any three Elective Subjects from the list given below:-

i)logic & philosophy (ii) Economics (iii) Education (iv) History (v)Political Science OR any of the following advanced languages subjects: i)Advance (Assamese , Bengali , Hindi , Manipuri)

In addition to the three elective subjects, a candidate may study a fourth elective subject as an option.

BA Three years degree Course (CBCS)

The institute is affiliated to Gauhati University, which has introduced the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for the graduate level courses (TDC) from the 2018-19 Academic Session. An UG course shall be of Six Semesters covering three Calendar Years (Academic Sessions – June to May). The duration of the Odd Semesters (First,Third and Fifth) shall be 'June to November', and that of Even Semesters (Second, Fourth and Sixth) shall be 'December to May'.

The minimum time requirement to acquire an undergraduate degree will be three years. The maximum time allowed to complete the programme will be six years. College may offer the following subjects in conformity with the combination of subjects permitted under the CBCS by the Gauhati University :-

General Course : i)English ii)Political Science (iii)Economics (iii) History (iv) Education (v) Logic and Philosophy (vi) MIL (Assamese, Bengali ,Hindi , Manipuri) vii) Alt (Assamese ,Hindi , Bengali ,Manipuri)

Major Course offered: i) English ii) Education iii) Political Science iv) Hindi ,v) Assamese vi) Bengali vii) History viii) Economics .

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Every teacher requires a great deal of persistence, motivation, and inspiration to achieve an overall improvement among their students. The challenge of the teachers is to comprehend the students interest area and build up a teaching plan to cover the syllabus in given time period.

- The college assesses the learning levels of the students and takes appropriate steps to deal with the slow learners and the advance learners. Students are assessed on a continuous basis through innovative and reformed techniques such as group discussions, assignments, analytical tests, practical's and projects. Accordingly, remedial classes and other techniques are used to support learners with different abilities and pace.
- Remedial/Tutorial classes are included in the daily class routine for supporting learners in small groups so that teachers can provide individual support.
- The institute has adopted a transparent time bound and efficient method to deal with internal and external examination by following the rules and guidelines of Gauhati University. Internal Tests and Assignments are held at important intervals and the Work sheets of the same are shown to the students. The College strives to minimize any grievance related to internal examinations and address any grievance accordingly.
- Institute believes in the adoption of students centric methods to enhance students involvement as a part of participative learning and problem solving methodology. College organize seminars, workshops to help the students to think wide participate in coming up with opinions and suggestion to check their knowledge. College organized Extension activities among the students to promote the spirit of team work.
- Subsequent efforts are taken by the institution in addition to the traditional classroom education, college uses information and communication Technology (ICT) in education support, enhance, optimize the delivery of education. During COVID pandemic, a full proof online examination was conducted for the final year students for awarding their degrees.
- Institution has framed policies in consultation with every department and Governing body of the college for the retention of the faculty members.

Research, Innovations and Extension

- The Research, Innovations and Extension of the college is well supported by a unique ecosystem that exists within the college.
- Our faculties have registered for PhD in renowned institutes of the country and 10 Faculty have completed their Doctoral research and one faculty is perusing PhD. The Academic research of the college has 3 papers in journal of UGC care list also has more than 123 journal publications and research papers in book chapters and renowned conference.
- To facilitate more research, the IQAC Committee organized Conferences, Seminars and workshops in

the institute.

- All departments arranges field trips, Projects to encouraged and strengthen experiential learning.
- The college have signed 03 MoUs with colleges for collaborative in teaching and learning, Research, cultural activities.
- During last five years college has conducted extension activities for the community through its NSS Unit red ribbon& NCC (In collaboration with Rabindra Nath Tagore University) the College actively organize Regular Activities like cleaning drives, awareness programmes on various subjects like road safety, Swachh Bharat, World Environment Day Celebrations, tree plantation programme ,Health awareness programme etc.
- The College celebrates Days of national importance by conducting various activities like extempore speech competitions, essay writing competitions, Drawing, painting and debate competition.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

- College has aesthetically designed buildings which are architecturally striking and responsive to preserve the natural habitat as much as possible.
- All the classrooms are furnished, spacious with good ventilation with sufficient illumination. The college has ICT enabled classrooms, departmental rooms, including an seminar hall cum classroom with a seating capacity beyond 200 to 250.
- The Education, department have lab that is well-designed and adequately equipped with learning resources and attached classroom for Honors classes.
- The College provides free internet accessibility to students besides Wi-Fi where students can freely access e-resources. The internet connection is currently with speeds of up to 250 Mbps on each line. Twenty one CCTVs installed at strategic points to monitor the campus activities.
- The library building is wi-fi enabled, having 5 computers and one laser printer with relevant hardware and software, and a rich repertoire of learning resources for teachers and students. Institute central library is on the first floor of the four storied building with a carpet area of 1253.9 square meters with a rich collection of books, reference, journals, Employment Newspaper and Newspaper section and reading room.
- The college has ICT enable smart class room having capacity of 250 students fitted with overhead Projector, interactive teaching Board & sound system to make the learning process more effective various innovative methods are used by the teachers
- There is a canteen in the college campus and institute makes monthly visits to the Canteen, keeping regular checks on the infrastructure, and conducting hygiene checks in the kitchen and related areas to ensure a qualitatively satisfactory food experience for our students.
- There is no separate exclusive playground of the college but it has two nos of college yards, one in the main campus and other in the B-block. These yards facilitate the students to play variety of games and sports. The outdoor sports facilities include a volleyball , cricket ,Kho –kho ,Kabaddi, open space for yoga ,two badminton court.
- The Institution has power house installed with Diesel Generator of ratings 25 KVA.

Student Support and Progression

The College for has created a robust students support system to facilitate equal opportunities for better academic and research outcomes, progression to higher education to achieve their goal. The practice of social inclusion, financial incentives and welfare measures has been internalized in the institutional processes.

- The college ensures prompt application and online payment of SC/ST/OBC/Minority scholarship provided by the State Government and the Government of India. Financial assistance is also given by college governing body to the needy students who are unable to pay their University examination fees.
- The faculty prepares an elaborate course plan, lesson plan and handouts by adhering to the academic calendar. College faculty takes Remedial and Tutorial Classes for slow learners to prepare them for remedial exams and also Providing readymade notes/ reading material to improve basic understanding of subject..
- Institute organizes co-curricular, extra-curricular and college week are being conducted to facilitate holistic development of the students and emerge as socially matured individuals.
- A significant number of students graduating from this college and pursuing higher education in various state and interstate Universities.
- The institution has a transparent mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances. Students are represented in several academic & administrative bodies/committees of the institution.
- The college has applied for Alumni Association registration and Alumni Meet is conducted annually; The institute Alumni has distinguished careers at State and national levels with successful chosen areas of expertise. Our students make us proud by excelling themselves as lecturers, lawyers, TET teachers, joining Para- military force, state Armed Police force, Private companies etc.

Governance, Leadership and Management

- The institution is a Provincialised Govt. Aided College controlled by Deptt. of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam, but managed by Governing Body of the College. The Principal is the sole .
- The Governing Body of the college meets on a regular basis to discuss issues related to the overall development of the institution. Similarly, Staff Council meetings are held periodically for the effective planning and implementation of teaching,
- The institution has implemented various effective measures for teaching and non teaching staff. Implementation of these schemes provide job satisfaction add developed teamwork, positive mind-set for secured future which ultimately helped in development of Institute.
- Institute encourages the teacher to acquire API score for promotion by following the statutory guideline of UGC Career Advancement scheme (CAS). Institute encourages and granted permission to the faculty members to participate in Refresher Courses/ Orientation Programmes / Short-term Courses, workshops for the professional development.
- The college conducts internal and external financial audits on a regular basis. The audit wing of the Chartered Accountant visits the college and inspects all files pertaining to the financial matters that the college has availed of, as well as all the receipts and payments in the college.
- Institution follows a well planned process for the mobilization of funds and the utilization of resources. In this process
- The IQAC plays an important role in the planning, execution and evaluation of all the Activities of an institution. The IQAC develop a academic and administrative activities throughout the Year for the improvement of students and the faculty member of the Institution.

1.1.1 The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

The Institution is affiliated to Gauhati University, so as per regulation of University the institution has implemented Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in 2019 which becoming more learner centric . CBCS offers the student a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the place, pace and time of learning. The undergraduate degree programme in the CBCS will have courses spread across six semesters. A typical semester will comprise a minimum of 15 to 18 weeks of academic work that will translate into 90 actual teaching days. Two consecutive (one odd and one even) semesters will make up an academic year. The minimum time requirement to acquire an undergraduate degree will be three years. The maximum time allowed to complete the programme will be six years.

College follows the academic calendar of University and prepares the academic calendar of the college which consists of curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities for effective implementation and delivery of curriculum. The following measures are undertaken by the institution for the effective delivery of the university curriculum at college.

Response:

- The college building is comprised of L – Patterned RCC two storied building and adjoining to the north end of this building there is another three stored building. The College building aesthetically designed buildings which are architecturally striking and responsive to environmental concerns to preserve the natural habitat as much as possible.
- The main building of the college accommodates the Classrooms, College Office room, Principal's room, Teacher's common room, Central Library, and other auxiliary rooms for varied Academic purposes. Besides the main campus, the College has another campus designated as B – Block having playground.
- The teaching block has well-appointed and spacious ICT enabled classrooms. The departments of Education have lab that is well-designed and adequately equipped with learning resources. The library building is Wi-Fi enabled, Computers with relevant hardware and software, and a rich repertoire of learning resources.
- There is one smart classroom with Tech upgrade tools, equipped with computer , Projector, Interactive teaching board, podium with a well audio visual facility, It has a sitting capacity of 200 students . Besides the classroom purpose this is also used for Seminar, workshops, meeting etc.
- There are 23 classrooms in total and these are of varied sized—ranging from 200 seating capacity for students to 20. These classrooms have sufficient number of windows, doors-there is no scarcity of light and air. There are adequate pair of desks and benches, chairs and tables. Classrooms are fully electrified, well equipped with necessary number of fans and lights necessary learning tools like marker boards etc.
- The college has two nos of college yards ,one within the Main campus and other in the B Block .this two yards the college facilitate the student to play variety of games and sports during College week. The outdoor sports facilities include a badminton court, volleyball, cricket pitch, open space for yoga etc.
- A canteen facility is available for the students inside the College campus. The college authority keeping regular checks on the infrastructure, and conducting hygiene checks in the kitchen and related areas to ensure a qualitatively satisfactory food experience for the students.
- There is a 25 KVA Generator for power back-up & 05 hand fire extinguishers in every exist point.
- Construction is under process for Departmental classroom, one to each, adjoining to the respective department, used for class and tutorial purposes mainly for honours students. Girls' common room is well furnished with essential amities like adequate number of fans, lights, attached lavatory, basins, facility of pure drinking water.
- There are 11sets of Computer in total having internet connectivity. The college is providing with free Wi-Fi, accessible to all in its campus. Besides, there are 4 (four) nos. of Xerox machines and 5(five) nos. of Printers.

All e-resources and services can be accessed through Internet and FTP (File Transfer Protocol) at any point of time by all the stakeholders .The College tries its best to make available ICT infrastructures to the students as well as teachers to facilitate teaching-learning activity.

- The Institute has 11 desktops and one laptop having HP workstation. There are 3 computers, 2 Laser jet printers, 3 inkjet printers in the office of the Principal,5 computers & 1 Laser jet printer in Library, I desktop with Printer in the Evaluation Centre, 1desktop with printer for Examination branch.
- The College provides free internet accessibility to students besides Wi-Fi where students can freely access e-resources. The internet connection is currently with speeds of up to 250 Mbps on each line.
- The College's internet facilities also enable students to register for their online scholarships and for their university examination /registration process.Students and teachers are provide with computer and printer facilities in library so as to enable them to prepare and disseminate study materials.
- The college has one smart class room having capacity of 250 students fitted with overhead Projector, interactive teaching Board & sound system to make the learning process more effective various innovative methods are used by the teachers. This includes giving group assignments and having power point presentations, where students can discuss and explore their knowledge together.
- Learning combined with visual presentations or working on certain software is much more enjoyable and comprehensive for the students.
- For monitoring the College campus 21 numbers of two mega Pixel CCTV Cameras connected with college Internet.

Software Infrastructure of the college

- The College has four high configuration servers to allow fast transmission of data to the various computers. These servers are: Windows Based Active Directory, Kaspersky antivirus, Library OPAC .
- Office automation packages like MS Office and Antivirus are purchased by the college and updated regularly.

Optimal utilization of resources :.

- Effective utilization of infrastructure is ensured through the appointment of adequate and well-qualified lab technicians. & encouraging innovative teaching-learning practices.
- The College physical infrastructure is utilized for co- curricular activities, PGHindi translationclasses, Parents teachers Meeting, medical camps etc.
- The college infrastructure is utilized as an Examination Centre for Government Examination /University Examinations, UG Examination Evaluation H.S, Examination Evaluation ,election training and other District Administration Meetings.

Internal Audit:

Financial audit is a continuous process which ensues after each and every financial transaction, whereby the college itself carries out the initial stage of the internal audit.

- Proper procedure for purchases is adopted by the Purchasing Committee of the College Quotations are called for and prices are compared. Department submits voucher, original invoice and supporting documents, including approvals of purchase to the account section.
- College maintains cash book ,Ledger book ,Stock Registers/Purchase Registers.
- Any grants received from the Govt. of Assam and MLAADP utilization certificates are prepared and submitted to Director of Higher Education, Assam and District administration annually.

External Audit :

The External Audit is conducted by the Chartered Accountant in accordance with auditing standards. Amounts and disclosures in the financial statements are verified on the basis of evidences.

- The financial records are audited by chartered accountants at the end of each financial year.
- All Government Scholarships and Funds received from Government as Grants are audited separately.
- The Chartered Accountant Physically checked all the bills and vouchers of the revenue expenditure, Departmental Accession Register, Stock Registers/Purchase Registers.
- All the audit objections/compliance is handled by the Accounts departmentand after queries the accountant of the college attended immediately along with the supporting documents within the prescribed time limits.

7.2.1 Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Response:

Faculty Retention

Any college or university that offers higher education should have a strong faculty. Quality faculty recruitment and retention are critical for educational institutions since a lack of faculty retention may have both financial and academic ramifications. Faculty members of higher education institutions mainly have three major elements in their job description, i.e. teaching, administrative duties and research. Keeping a sound balance of distribution among all the three elements over an academic year is of utmost importance for the job satisfaction of a faculty member. All these three components need time, devotion, dedication, skills and expertise..

One of the most important factors for a faculty member to stay in an educational environment may be the status of job, i.e. tenure tracked, permanent, contract based, temporary, adjunct etc. Permanent employees are more relaxed and their retention is expected to be higher than others. On the other hand, contract based and adjunct faculty members usually search for better opportunities. Institution employed strategies like overloading the teachers, hiring under or over qualified teachers, and employing temporary teachers for long periods of time to meet the supply and demand requirements and it ended up with low retention rate.

Institute has framed policies in consultation with every department and Governing Body of the institution for the retention of the faculty members.

Provisions are made to enhance salaries of the contractual faculty members time to time.

Workload balance is critical to the success of retaining faculty, so the work load of the faculty members is

relatively rational as it is fairly distributed by each department.

For attracting the faculty members, institution provide good working environment like proper coordination among the faculty members of different departments of the institution. A part from this there is a good relation between the administration and its staff.

For training and research work the institution always encourages the faculty members.

The institution is always following the transparency in administrative procedures toward faculty members.

- The institution has accountability for every faculty concern to build of a trusting environment within the institution.
- To create a good informal relationship with the faculty members the institution organized picnic, celebration of faculty's birthday/marriage anniversaries, etc. Above all, the senior faculty members of the department also hosted social and departmental events to foster interaction among groups of colleagues

Teaching and learning

There are different types of students, some learn very fast and some learn slowly. Some students need only guidance and some need regular attention, guidance and mentoring. Each type of students has different learning attitudes and learning habits. In such a situation, it is crucial to understand them from different viewpoints and recognize their learning levels and plan accordingly to deliver learner centric teaching and learning. Enriching teaching and learning of students depend upon the two way interaction and hard work of student, parent and teacher. Scanning of feedback from the stakeholder also provide an opportunity to realize our strength and weakness. This best practice helps to support & design, modify the curriculum as per feedback of stakeholders.

Institute provides quality teaching-learning to students offering the learner centric teaching learning which recognize that the learning interest and pace of every pupil is different. On the basis of students' preceding exam and current subject performance and basic knowledge, learning level of the learners can be classified in two groups – slow learners and advance learners for each subject.

Teachers regularly monitoring the students behavior, manner, habit, attitude, learning styles, confidence level in the class, self-esteem, self-awareness, decision making skill, interest in learning, special interest, hobbies, and classroom performance.

Professor is assigned 50 students to guide throughout the session/ semester. The teacher keeps monitoring the academic record of each student in the group. Attending counseling session is mandatory for every student.

Evidence of success –

- Evidence of success of the practice includes better results, less dropout, increased participation in extra and Co-Curriculum activities.
- The mentoring system is implemented in each department successfully and significant

improvements in the attendance and results have been observed. The students are more relaxed and have healthy relationships with the staff.

- The slow and advanced learners' assessment has been implemented successfully in all the departments and significant numbers of slow learners are converted to advanced learner in each semester.
- The number of irregular students got reduced and gradual increase the pass percentage of students noticed from 1st semester to 6th semester.
- **Problems encountered and Resources Required-**
- Students Relationships issue with Principal, teacher's faculty, non teaching staff. Changing the moods and attitudes towards teaching process .
- Shortage of sufficient number of teaching staff in the Institution. Lack of experienced Counselors' for slow learner students.
- The system can be made more vibrant and fruitful if the governments fill up the vacant posts. Some Students who are economically poor are not able to pay their Examination fee in that case college bear, so that they can appear the examination.
- Our traditional practice of conducting such feedback is an offline mode. Due to this, comparatively fewer responses were received from the learners

Problems Encountered and resources required.

- The present major challenge is to recruit and retain qualified and experienced faculty in the institute.
- Institute unable to offers better pay packages, compensation and career opportunities, encouraging academic regulations, research money, and a remuneration package.
- Schedule from the higher education commission encourage people to enter academia as a career of their choosing thus making difficulties for educational institutes.
- Firing and resignation of faculty creates several other issues for administration, such as the cost of hiring new faculty, the inability to have faculty on time.

The students who are unable to bear the college fee, the College Governing Body provided fee concession & free admission upto 2017-18. After 2017 the Govt of Assam declared free admission to all those students whose family income is 2 lakhs. College also exempts the students who are unable to bear examination fee of University, Examination Centre fees of the college.

The college also undertakes several initiatives to sensitize students to gender equity, energy conservation measures, inclusiveness, human values etc. Keeping all these in view, the college organizes several programmes such as lectures, popular talks, workshops, seminars, sports competition, activities under NSS , Extension Activity Committee of the college at a regular interval in the college campus as well as in the local areas. The college always ensures participation of students as well as of the local people in such programmes of the college. So that students and local people can be sensitized to such issues.
