

The curriculum is designed & developed by the Dibrugarh University, Assam. The College does not have the autonomy in the curriculum aspects.

The college does not have any research council similar to that of a University. But the College has its own research committees to help the faculty members especially to encourage them to undertake research activities including Ph. D. M.Phil, Minor & Major projects.

The library has the sufficient numbers of books & journals proportionate to the students of the college. The Computer and reading room facilities are also available in the Library.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Encouragements are provided to teachers to participate in Orientation and Refresher Courses. Participation in Seminars and Workshops are directly related to prospects of career advancement of the teaching staff.

- a. The faculty is being provided with a reasonably well maintained and functional office, departmental rooms, Common Room, Departmental and Central Library, Reading Room, spacious Canteen and parking facilities so that they can carry out their work efficiently.
- b. Student's awareness program is organized for student's development.
- c. Training program is provided to non-teaching staff.

6.3.7 Faculty and staff recruitment

The College follows the rules and regulations laid down by the State Government for recruitment of faculty members and staff.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction/Collaboration

The entire district of Lakhimpur is industrially backward. There are no large and medium scale industries available in the district yet. But, the college has undertaken various steps to make an interaction with local SSI units as well as government departments like social forestry, agriculture, industry, SIRD etc.

The admission of students in B.A and Higher Secondary courses is strictly made on the basis of merit. In addition to the admission notification, detailed information is incorporated in admission prospectus. The Admission Committee fixed the norms of admission in consultation with college authority, college noticed board. Students from boards and universities other than SEBA, AHSEC and Dibrugarh University shall have to produce migration certificate at the time of admission is very obligatory.
