ABSTRACT AND FULL PAPER SUBMISSION

The organizing committee invites delegates / participants to submit abstract for presentation (oral or poster) along with full paper under the given thematic areas. All contributions (posters, talks and keynote lectures) in the form of an abstract, including

all authors, will be available on Zenodo, a rapidly growing open-access international platform. Further, full papers will be considered for publication in an international peer-reviewed journal by a reputed publishing house.

The manuscript / abstract must be written in English with the title of the paper, name of author (s), and designation. The abstract should not exceed 250 words.

The title should be clear, descriptive and not too long. It should be typed in bold letter in upper-lower case. There should be the use of subjective statement only.

The title will be followed by name(s) of author(s), followed by complete address of affiliation with PIN/ZIP, without designation, superscripted with numerical, e.g. M. K. Deb¹, S. S. Rathore¹, S. B. Singh², P. K. Yadav³ and Prakash Singh⁴, followed by address of affiliation.

All abstracts must be submitted through online (along with registration form) or sent as e-mail attachment to ictknowgongcollege@gmail.com addressing the Organizing Secretary, on or before 5th March, 2024.

The full papers must be submitted on or before 15th March, 2024 as per the Author's Guidelines.

PRESENTATION

Abstracts under the given thematic areas will be selected for oral / poster presentation. The lead speaker will be given 15 minutes (including discussion) for the presentation.

The speakers of contributory papers will be given 8 minutes including discussion.

For poster presentation, the size of the poster should be 80 cm (B) x 100 cm (L), briefly showing title, Author's Name & Address, Introduction with Objective, Methodology, Results and Discussion (Tables, Figures and Photographs), bulleted Summary or Conclusion.

The poster should be designed attractively with appropriate colour scheme so that the content is readable from a distance of at least one meter.

The organizing committee reserves the right to delegate the mode of presentation depending on the number of papers and merit of the paper based on originality/novelty of research work. Not more than two abstracts/papers from each participant will be entertained.

INVITED / LEAD SPEAKERS: Leading scientists or faculties in the relevant subjects of the conference will be invited as speaker.
