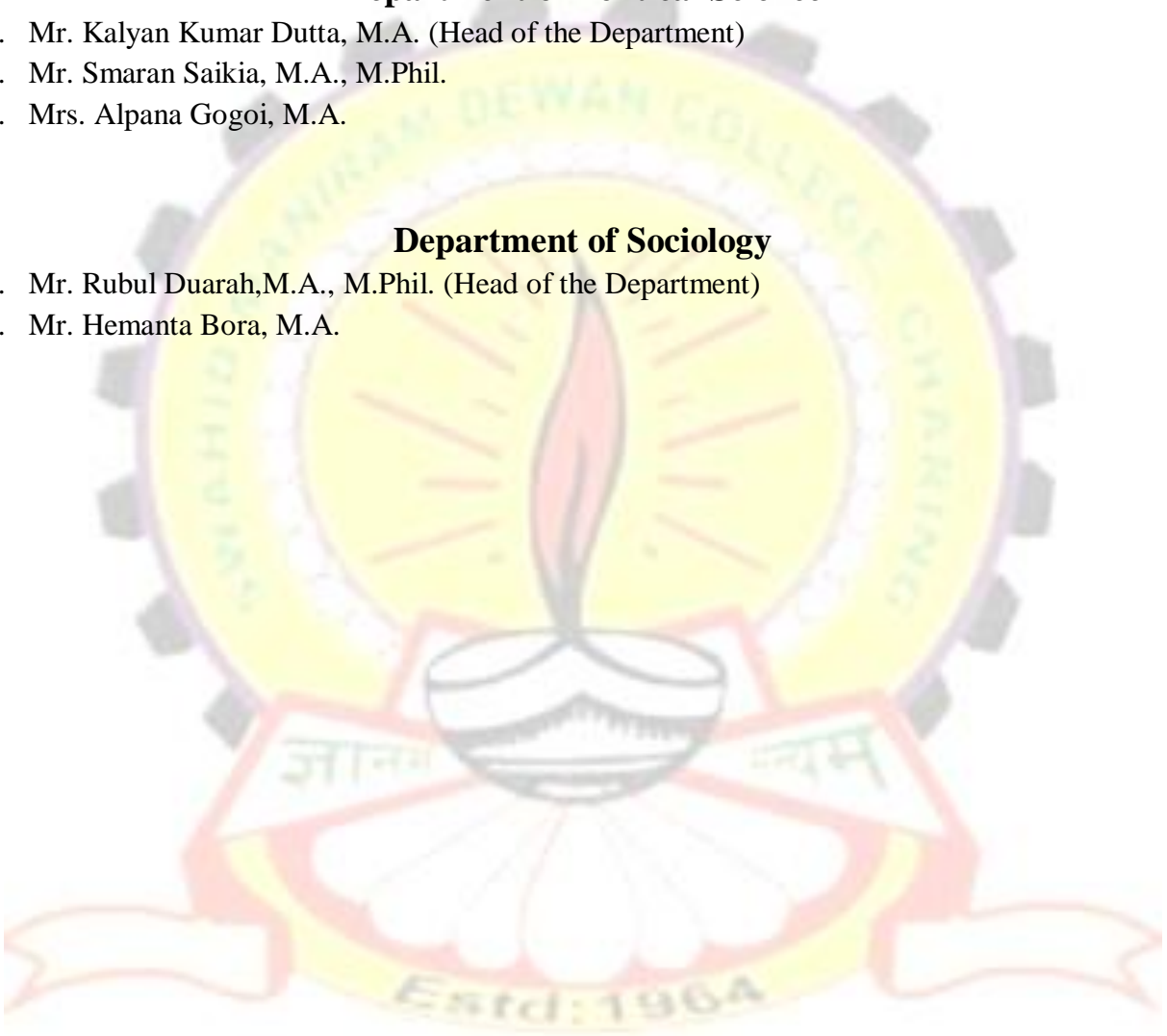

Admission Procedure and Requirements

Application for admission into Higher Secondary/ T.D.C. Courses are dealt with by the college through online system. Prescribed application forms may be obtained from the official College Website (www.smdcollegecharing.edu.in) during the notified period. Applicants should fill up the online form and submit it.

The scrutiny of the application forms, and selection of applicants for admission are done by an admission Committee constituted for this purpose. In case of admission to the Major Courses, the screening is done by the respective department and admission is given on the basis of their recommendations. The applicants must attach the following documents along their application forms:

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college library is the key resource of information for the academic community. It started functioning right from the beginning of the College in 1964. The Library boast of having books,Journal and Magazine which caters to the the academic needs. Xerox facility is also available in the library which is now computerized.

Rules and Regulations of the Library :

1. All students and members of the teaching staff are members of the college library.
2. The library shall be functioning on all working days from 9.00 A.M to 4.00 P.M.
3. Silence shall be strictly observed in all parts of the Library.
4. Entrance to the Reading Room and the Reference Section is permitted only to students who have their identity cards with them.
5. The Librarian has the right to recall a book at 24 hours' notice.
6. The Library is divided into :
 - A. The Reference Library and Reading Room
 - B. The General Library
 - C. The Reference Library and Reading Room
4. Books placed in the Reference Library shall not be lent out to any member. They will be issued for use only in the library during the library hours.
5. Newspapers and periodicals will be placed for use in the Reading Room. They will not be issued to students.
6. Periodicals shall not be misplaced from the positions on shelves or tables.

G. The General Library

8. Students who wish to borrow books from the lending section and consult and refer to books and journals have to register their names in the library and get the membership cards at the beginning of the course. Membership cards have to be renewed at the beginning of every academic year.
9. Application for books should be made in the prescribed slips available in the library.
10. Borrowed books should be returned within two weeks. They can be reissued for a further period of two weeks if no one else has applied for them.
11. Failing to return a book on or before the due date, a student has to pay an overdue charge of Rs.1/- per day of delay for each book.
12. When a book is returned, the membership card has to be taken back from the library counter.
13. Students are not allowed to pass books from one to another or to lend them to any one in or out of the college. They will be held responsible for loss or damage of books lent to them. Marking on books and spoiling of binding or illustrations will be treated as serious damage. Before books are taken out students should make sure that books are in good condition.
14. Personal belongings such as books, periodicals, bags, umbrella, mobile phone etc. should not be taken into the library. Such articles can be kept at the property counter near the entrance. Money or ornaments should never be kept at the property counter. The librarian cannot take the responsibility for the loss of any items kept at the property counter.
15. Students are required to sign in a register when a book or periodical is taken for reading.
16. "" No Due Certificate"" will be given only after returning the books and the membership cards.



Registration :

The students should register themselves under the Dibrugarh University and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council respectively.

Attendance:

A students should attend a minimum of 80% classes held during an academic year. Students whose attendance falls bellow 80% but remains above 70% will be considered as non-collegiate. Students with attendance below 70% will be debarred from appearing in the final examination.

Identity Card:

A non-transferable Identity Card is issued to each bonafide students at the time of admission. For this, a passport size photograph is to be attached with the admission form.

Students' Welfare Activities:

Scholarships are offered by State and Central Government viz.State Merit/ National Merit/O.B.C., M.O.B.C., S.C., S.T. scholarships.

The college also offers financial assistance to poor and meritorious students out of the Students' Welfare Fund. Moreover, Shikhyak Karmachari Bata is annually awarded to the B.A. 1st Year class student who passes the H.S. Examination in the First Division securing the highest marks in the batch. Two other awards are offerd by the Deptt. Of Political Science and Assamese to the B.A. 1st Semester who secure at least 80% marks in Political Science and Assamese respectively at the Higher Secondary Examination.

Class Rooms:

Classes in the college are held in the day shift only. The academic activities of the college runs from 9-15 a.m. to 4 p.m. All class rooms are well equipped with Black Board for old traditional chalk and board method of teaching and White Marker Board for modern method of teaching with latest model of Audio-visual Aids such as OHP, L.C.D. projector, Paxy-scopes etc.

Seminar Hall :

The seminar room is a modern and state-of-art facility "comparable to the best" that any equivalent institution has to offer. Prominent seminars to acquaint the students with new trends and development in academics and the industrial sector are a regular feature.

Examination Hall:

There is an Examination Hall on the first floor of the main Administrative Building to conduct H.S and University Examinations.

Students' Day Room :

There is a Students' Day Home comprising of a Boys' Common Room, a Girls', Common Room and an Officer Room for the Students' Union. Students are provided with newspapers and magazines in the common rooms along with recreational facilities.

College Canteen:

The College has a Canteen which provides controlled refreshment to the college students at a normal price determined by the college authority.

Hostel Facility :

The College provides hostel facilities for girls only. The total capacity for the Hostel is presently 10 students. Outstation candidates are given preference.

College Health Care Service :

The college authority is well alive to health care of the students and employees of the college organizes time to time health check up of students with the help of the local Govt. State Dispensary Proper Drinking Water through water cooler is provided to the students of the college. All building of the college are provided with proper, sanitation facilities.

Sports Facility :

The College has a good playground with necessary facilities for outdoor games and sports like football and cricket. There are ample facilities for athletics and other minor games like carom, badminton, volley ball etc.

Gymnasium:

The college has a well equipped gymnasium, which provides modern facilities for students' health and physique along with indoor games. The college encourages the outstanding sports persons by awarding medals and certificates of proficiency. Incentives in the shape of financial aid to such persons and also to participants taking part in various inter-college, inter-district, state or national level competitions are offered from time to time.

College Dress Code:

Wearing of approved college uniform is compulsory both for boys and girls. The uniform for boys is white shirt and navy blue trouser and that for girls is Muga or Muga-coloured Mekhela, white chador with bottle-green border and bottle green blouse / White Salwar Kurta with Green Dupatta for Girls (Legging, Churidar and Sleeveless tops are not allowed) are made optional choice for girls.

College Badge:

Bonafide students are directed to wear the college badge issued to them while coming to the college.

N.S.S. :

The college has an N.S.S. wing under the charge of a Programme Officer who is the Prof, of the College. This scheme provides the students with ample scope to get themselves involved in social welfare activities.

N.C.C(Boys):

After the realization of need to create a youth organization at National level to train the young boys and girls to be better citizens and future leaders of our great country in all walks of life, NCC came into existence on 16th July, 1948 under the NCC Act XXXVI of 1948 under the Ministry of Defence (MOD). With its motto 'Unity and Discipline' NCC strives to be and is one of the greatest cohesive forces of our nation, bringing together the youth hailing from different parts of our country and moulding them into united and disciplined citizens of our nation. NCC aims to develop character, dedication, discipline, leadership, spirit of adventure, sportsmanship and ideals of selfless service among the youth of the country. It creates a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life and always be available for the service of the nation. Apart from this it aims to provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces. Training in NCC instills qualities like nationalism, patriotism, discipline, team spirit, esprit-de-corps, leadership, self-confidence and promotes overall personality development. NCC gives a tremendous opportunity to one and all for betterment irrespective of caste, creed religion or economic status.

Scout and Guide:

In accordance with the state government directives, it has been decided to introduce Scout(Boys) and Guide (Girls) scheme since 2002. The enrolled members of Scout and Guide are intended to develop character and teach self-reliance, discipline and enhance public spirit.

Students' Union:

The students' union of the college is elected by the bonafide students of the college one in a year. They observe their own constitution. The annual sports as well as the cultural and literary activities are conducted by the Students' Union under the guidance of the teacher in charge. The Principal of the college is the President of the Union.

Women's Studies Cell:

Since its inception on the 9th February, 2004, the Women's Cell of S.M.D. College has been involved in various social and other related activities for all round development of the institution as well as of the students.

Career Counselling and Placement Cell :

The College provides Career Guidance to the students on a regular basis besides providing information on placements in different Govt., Semi-Govt. and other private sectors by organizing counseling sessions under the aegis of its Career Counselling and Placement Cell.

Day Care-cum-Montessori Centre:

The college is running a Day Care-cum-Montessori Centre under supervision of the Deptt. of Education which not only provides scope for providing Day-Care to children of working parents, but also extend scope to the Major students of Education department to learn partially about mental growth and development of the children.

Student's Grievance Redressal Cell:

There is a Grievance Cell in the college to look after the grievances of the students, whenever it is necessary. The students may intimate their grievance to the college committee, by dropping a petition in the grievance box specied and placed in front of the college office.

Red Ribbon Club:

There is a Red Ribbon Club in the College for awareness programme and remedial measures for infectious disease. It is conducted under the supervision of a teacher.

Eco-Club:

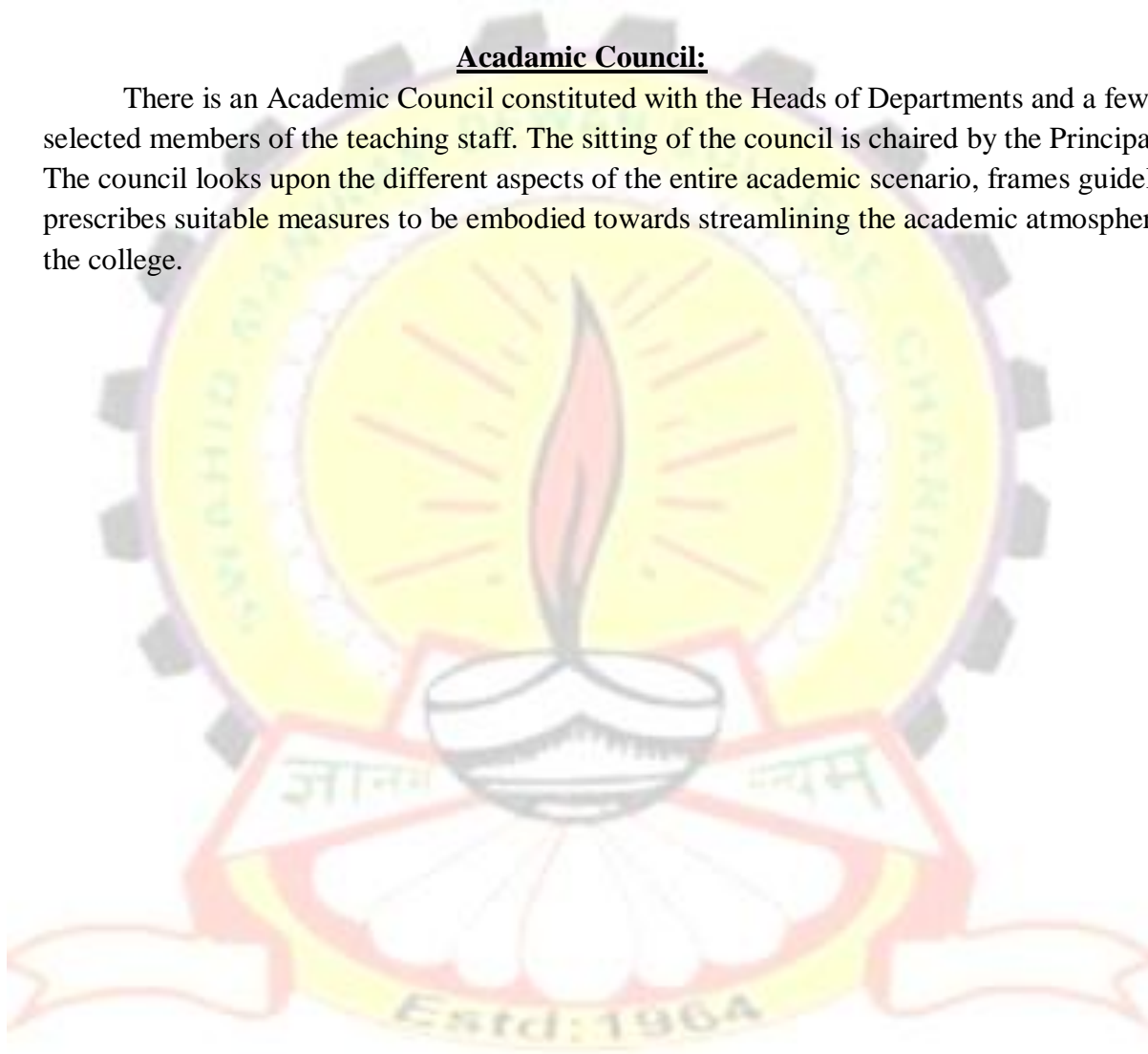
The Eco-Club constituted under the supervision ASTEC, Govt. of Assam, caters to the biological and natural environment of the college. The Club under the supervision of a teaching staff looks after the natural environment of the college by undertaking plantation drives. The Club is presently is initiating to build up a Herbal Garden in the campus.

Academic aspects:

Admission to H.S. 1st Year and Three Years Degree Courses begins immediately after the announcement of Higher Secondary Final Year and B.A. Semester results. Classes are held in full swing after the admission phase is over. Periodical class tests are conducted by all the departments so as to assess the students' progress in their studies. Departmental seminars are held every month to make the students aware of their course of studies.

Academic Council:

There is an Academic Council constituted with the Heads of Departments and a few selected members of the teaching staff. The sitting of the council is chaired by the Principal. The council looks upon the different aspects of the entire academic scenario, frames guidelines, prescribes suitable measures to be embodied towards streamlining the academic atmosphere of the college.



General rules for maintenance of discipline:

1. The students admitted to the college must abide by all the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority.
2. No student shall be admitted to any class as aforesaid if he/she is found to have indulged in activities detrimental to the academic interest.
3. A student who is found to have indulged in consumption of drugs or intoxicating drinks, gambling and other immoral activities shall be liable to expulsion & further disciplinary action.
4. Violation of rules, indiscipline and misconduct of any kind may lead to disciplinary action like expulsion from the college.
5. College uniform is compulsory in the classrooms and college functions. Students without uniform will not be allowed to attend their classes. Students found without uniform will be suspended for a week.
6. . Students are expected to participate in all forms of college functions and co-operate in keeping the college campus neat & clean.

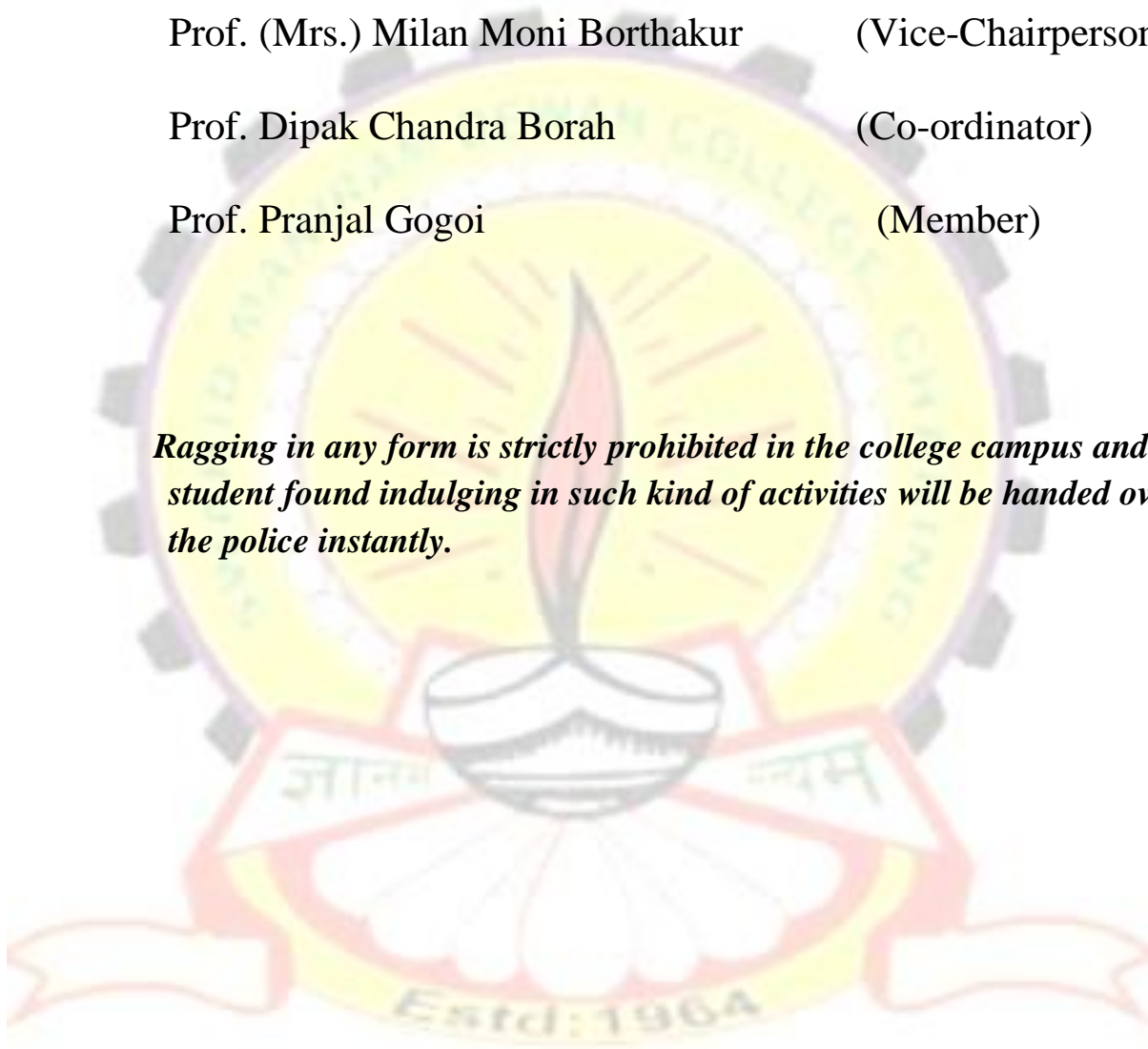
