Section I : INTRODUCTION

About the College

The Sonari College, located at Sonari Town, is a leading educational institution in the Charaideo Sub-division under Charaideo District. It has been imparting education in the Arts stream since its inception on the 5th of August, 1970. With the initiation of the Science stream in 1984, the institution has provided an enormous impetus to fulfilling the long-felt needs of the students of this vast locality. The college offers Major/Honours programmes in five faculties incorporating eleven disciplines. The college makes all possible efforts to cope with the growing needs of higher education and include additional subjects in line with the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020. The academic achievements of the students of the college are praiseworthy as reflected in their academic performance and in the educational benchmarks attained by them. The overall percentage of student progression into various fields is also impressive. Students have also been consistently performing well in sports and co-curricular activities in the institutional, district, state and national levels. The distinguished faculty members of the college are always keen to guide and encourage students with zeal and dedication. The institution has adopted a well rounded Mentorship Program to provide proper guidance in all spheres to the students. The institution is committed to continue to render its faithful services to the evolving society to which it is ever accountable. No student is allowed to enter the College campus without proper uniform.

Section II: General Information

1) <u>Admission Procedure</u> :

Admission into various programmes in Sonari College is done through online mode. The authority provides an Admission Notification which is uploaded in the College website. Candidates seeking admission have to submit the Admission Form along with all requisite documents by using the Admission Portal of the College. Admission is generally made on merit basis. However, provision of reservation is made as per Reservation Guidelines of Govt. of Assam and Directorate of Higher Education. After submission of Admission Forms, Merit List / selected list is prepared and students are allowed to take admission accordingly.

There will be no change in Subjects after getting Registration.

Admission Board :

All matters relating to admission will be taken up by the Admission Board. The Board consists of the Principal as Chairperson, Vice-Principal as Vice-Chairperson and the Heads of

Departments as members. The Board will also be expanded to include the Heads of the Institutions of Colleges included in the Cluster System with Sonari College.

Scrutiny Board :

There will be a Scrutiny Board Consisting of members of teaching faculty who will verify the documents for considering the Admission.

Process of Admission:

The list of eligible candidates for Admission will be notified on Merit Basis. However, statutory reservation policy of the Government shall be followed.

- <u>Registration</u>: After admission, the students have to fill-in the Registration Form. The University/Council will send Registration Card in due course. Students must collect their Registration Card from the college office intime.
- 3) <u>Library Facility</u>: The College has a big Library with huge collections of Text Books Reference books, Journals, Magazines, newspapers along with the library has two open spaced reading rooms for students and teachers. The library is availing membership of INFLIBNET consortia. The NLIST provides access to 6000+ ejournals and more than 1,64,300 e-books. The students can also avail the benefits of various rare books, reputed journals, magazines, encyclopaedia etc. The library has complete automation system. It is well stocked with special collections of the "Baisali Mohan Trust" and also has the Book Bank facility for economically backward students.

Library Services-

- We are providing automated Circulation Service.
- The Library is running with online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). Internet facility are available at the library.

- We display our current books and journal list in the periodical section as library new arrivals. We are providing user orientation programme for students.
- The entire library is under close circuit camera surveillance.
- The Library has an Institutional Repository. The repository is well stocked with publications of Sonari College Magazines, Journals, Edited Books, Conference Proceedings, Lecture Notes, Audio and Video Lectures, Questionpapers, teachers' and student's Research Publications etc.
- Every year Sonari College Library offers an award known as "Best Reader Award" to students.

General Rules for Using Library :

Students are to collect library cards at the time of admission. Students of H.S. class can borrow two books and students of degree course can borrow 3 for major and 2 for non major at a time which they must return within a period of 15 days, otherwise they shall have to pay a late fine of Rs. 5/- (five) per day, per book. Students must get library clearance certificate from the librarian before issue of Admit Card for various examinations. A borrower will have to pay the price of any book that lost or damaged in his/her custody or must replace the book.

4) <u>Attendance</u> :

Attendance in the class is compulsory for all students. Those students who fail to attend a minimum of 70% of the Classes will not be allowed to appear in the University & Council examination. If their attendance is found less than 70%, they will be declared as dis-collegiate according to the rules set down by NEP, 2020. *Those Students whose are declared as dis-collegiate students, will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.*

5) <u>Examination</u>:

The Examinations of the HS Programme will be held as per the schedule notified by AHSEC. In Under-Graduate Programmes there will be One in-semester examination and One end-semester examination per Semester. The In-Semester examination is compulsory for all students. Those failing to appear will be debarred from the final end-semester examination... The examinations of the degree courses will be conducted according to the Dibrugarh University Examination Regulation, 1972 (with latest amendments) and the guidelines of the NEP, 2020 as stated below.

(a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.

(b) There shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.

(c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

(d) The mode of end-semester examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the detailed syllabus of the course concerned.

(e) End-semester practical examinations shall normally be held before the theory examinations.

In-Semester Assessment:

(i) In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.

(ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

End Semester Examination:

(i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.

(ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.

(iii) The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course.

(iv) Emphasis needs to be given on problem solving, application level questions as prescribedby National Education Policy, 2020. The question paper should include different forms ofquestion.

Confidential Works: Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance.

The mode of the conduct of the end-semester examinations of the practical/dissertation courses shall be partially external as below:

- The end-semester examinations of all practical/dissertation courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the internal examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an external examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
- A student shall not be allowed to take more than one full course as project work in a single semester.

Betterment Examination:

i) A student shall be entitled to take the 'Betterment Examinations' in any two theory courses after successful completion of 3 year/4year programme only once. In this case, the

higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth/Eight Semester examination. Students shall have to appear in the betterment examination with the regular batch.

ii) No betterments shall be allowed in the practical/project/dissertation/internship examinations.

Results and Progression:

- i) A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures-
- ii) At least 30% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations
- iii) At least 'P' grade in the10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End Semester Examination performance.
- iv) There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.
- v) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.
- vi) There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.
- vii) The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- viii) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any end semester examinations up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses. If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components.
- ix) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.

x) A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). If a candidate clears the eight semester examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.

- xi) A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for three year undergraduate programme and seven years for four year undergraduate programme (with honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.
- xii) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.
- xiii) A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.
- xiv) The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.
- xv) The first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the basis of the CGPA. However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.
- xvi) Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.

Provision of Multiple Exit:

Exit 1: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 1 year (two semesters). A Certificate will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 1 (2 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 44 credits will be awarded a UG certificate (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 2^{nd} semester examination.

Exit 2: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 2 years (four semesters. A Diploma will be awarded when a student exits at the end of year 2 (4 semesters). Students who have secured minimum of 88 credits will be awarded a UG Diploma (in the field of study/discipline) if, in addition, they complete one work based/skill based vocational course/internship of 4 credits within one year from the completion of 4th Semester examination.

Exit 3: Three Year UG Degree Programme (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: There is a provision of exit after successful completion of 3 years (six semesters). Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme shall be awarded UG degree in the major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits.

At the end of the Fourth UG Year students can opt for degree in the following ways

a) Four Year UG Programme with Honours (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years with Discipline Specific Elective Courses in 7th and 8th semesters in lieu of Research Project and Dissertation, securing a minimum of 176 credits.

b) Four Year UG Programme with Honours with Research (BA, B. Sc, B. Com and Bachelor in other discipline) with single/double major: Students who wish to undergo a 4-year (8 semester) UG programme shall be awarded UG Honours with Research degree in the major discipline after successful completion of four years, with Research Project and Dissertation in 7^{th} and 8^{th} Semesters, securing 176 credits.

6) Financial Aids to Students :

Teachers' Aid Fund :

The teachers' unit of the College provides financial assistance to needy students through the Student Welfare Fund. The eligible students can apply for financial help from this fund. The Fund Committee after taking into consideration all aspects determines the financial help to be offered. Financial assistance is also given to the best graduates in Arts and Science in each year from this fund. Additionally, there is also an Aid Fund for students which is maintained by the Institution.

7) Hostel Facility:

There is one Girls' Hostel and one Boys' Hostel in this institution. Sufficient number of bathrooms, latrines, electricity facility and water supply are made for the students. These two hostels are managed by the wardens appointed by the college authority. Moreover, there are two separate Hostel Management Committees for Boys' and Girls' Hostel each.

In case of allotment of seat in the hostels, preference is given according to the merit of the boarders & distance of their homes from the college.

Some Important Rules for Hostel Boarders :

i) Boarders must abide by the rules & regulations of the hostel prescribed by the college authority, violation of which will be liable to disciplinary action to the extent of expulsion from the hostel & the college as well.

ii) Boarders must enter the hostel within the time fixed by the authority concerned.

iii) Entertainment of the guest & visitors will not be allowed except prior permission of the authority.

iv) Ill treatment/ragging to co-boarders/cook/other employees of the hostel are strictly prohibited.

v) Disturbance of any kind during study hours will be treated as a serious offence.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) and Scout and Guide are two organizations which provides opportunity for students to develop their personality through community Service. The both sections of Sonari College offers opportunity to students in this direction. Students can engage themselves in the NSS and Scout and Guide activities & for these they may contact **Dr.** Lucky Chetia, Assistant Profesdsor, Deptt. of Political Science.

11) Code of Conduct :
